#### Moving forward

491 Families and Carers have applied for the Academic Year Holiday Support - 2022/2023. Everyone should have received their allocation letter. If not, please contact <a href="mailto:holidaysupport@edinburgh.gov.uk">holidaysupport@edinburgh.gov.uk</a> The application form will stay open all year for new Families and Carers to apply, however provision left is now very limited.

We had 102 young people attend the October Holiday Hub.

Thank you to everyone who paid for their session promptly, communicated quickly if they were declining and stayed connected if they had any barriers to accepting the placement.



# Branch Out Together – Outdoor Education

- Branch Out Together ran a very successful holiday hub at Prospect Bank School this summer. They also offered for the first time an Outdoor Education program with Broomlee Centre. This was a fantastic opportunity for some of our 13+ young people.
- Branch Out Together ran a Make Tracks program in October and will do the same in February. Young people might be at Dynamic Earth, trying the Aquadash or visiting a Fringe show. 9 Young people were out and about in the October break and had a lovely experience.

Justin has now moved on from The Yard and Tricia Stewart will be the new manager. We wish Justin all the best. - The aim is to increase provision and I am excited to say that in Easter we will be going from 17 children per week at Oaklands to 22 children per week.

Barnardo's have also been able to access the pool at Braidburn and link in with the lifeguards who have been recruited.

#### Braidburn Hub



Braidburn Hub is one of our biggest hubs with 40 children each week attending. The hub is run by a Seaview Managers along with their Behaviour Support team and school staff.

A massive thank you to Wendy Brown, Lesley Robertson and Karen Japp who ran the summer provision. The hub in the summer was open for 240 children which is not an easy task.

In October Lesley Robertson and Jean Cole ran the October Hub and I am pleased to say they were at full capacity with 40 young people.

Without their support and the support of David and Sophie from the Seaview behaviour team this provision would not happen.

#### <u>Partnerships</u>

- We are very lucky to have worked with Jill Coleman and the Active Schools Team. They have helped recruit 2 lifeguards to work at the Braidburn Hub over the next year. Barnardo's Hub at Oxgang Primary School will also have the opportunity to access the swimming pool at Braidburn School. Great teamwork!
