

Homelessness Prevention Support Guide

How to use this guide

This guide gives contact details for services that provide advice and support to Edinburgh residents. Most services are free.

The guide is split into various sections, roughly corresponding to common causes of homelessness or at-risk groups. However, most organisations listed can provide support across a range of areas and if they are unable to help, they will direct to a service that can.

Use the <u>Quick Reference</u> page to find contacts for specific issues. Underlined links will take you quickly to the correct page. Click $\widehat{\ }$ at the top and bottom of every page to return to the Quick Reference page.

If somebody you are working with asks for help, or you identify a possible unmet support need, you can use this guide in one of 3 ways:

Signposting

• If your service user is capable, you can provide contact details and direct them to the appropriate place. This empowers people to seek help themselves, but carries the risk that they may not engage

Referral

• You can complete a formal referral to the appropriate service and request that they make contact with your service user. This may mean they are more likely to receive the appropriate support, but you will need consent to do this. Some service providers require a formal referral.

Advice

• If you are confident to do so, or if you have built a good relationship with your service user and fear they may not engage easily with a 3rd party, you can request the appropriate information and provide advice yourself

However you use this guide, the important thing is that those in need can access the necessary help, no matter where they go to ask for it.

Young People

Young people [16-25 year olds] are over-represented in the homeless population. This age group may be at greater risk of homelessness due to a lack of experience, lower income, or volatile home life. The experience of homelessness is detrimental to education, employment prospects, health, and relationships. It can also be a predictor of homelessness in later life.

Young people may be more likely to be sofa surfing or staying temporarily with family. Young people may benefit from a referral to the <u>PRS Team</u>, <u>income maximisation</u> and employability services. There are also several specialist services:

Financial

Financial worries can be detrimental to physical and mental health. Households who are struggling financially often face a choice between food, heating or rent. Unemployment or low income can lead to rent arrears and homelessness. Debt can be a barrier to accessing the full range of housing options if a household needs to find new accommodation.

Receiving financial advice and support can help maintain tenancies and give greater freedom of choice if a move is required. An estimated £1.7 billion in financial assistance goes unclaimed each year, so any household may benefit from an entitlement check.

Domestic Abuse

The most common cause of homelessness for women is domestic violence or abuse. If you are working with somebody who is experiencing this their safety is the main priority. Advise that <u>temporary accommodation</u> is available at any time, but homelessness does not have to be inevitable. You should also encourage them to contact their landlord, <u>housing officer</u> or Police Scotland to explore options to make it safe to remain in their home. If a move is required, the <u>PRS Team</u> may be able to facilitate this without the need to access temporary accommodation.

Relationship breakdown/conflict in the home

The most common reasons given for a homeless presentation are being asked to leave previous accommodation, or non-violent dispute within the household. This could be relationship breakdown, being asked to leave the family home or conflict between flatmates.
