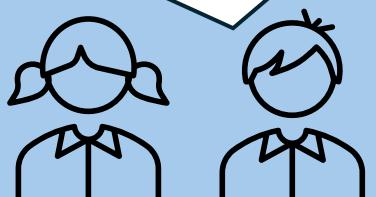

1.2. Our teachers lead sport clubs and groups

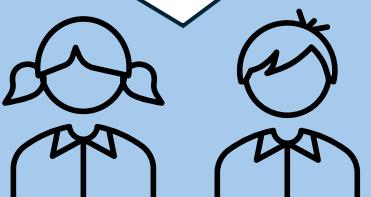
- Mr Egea – P5 to P7 Lunchtime Basketball

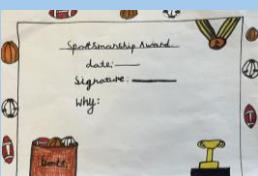

3.1. We provide opportunities for pupils to take part in sport throughout the school year – health week, taster sessions, sports day, events and residential trips.



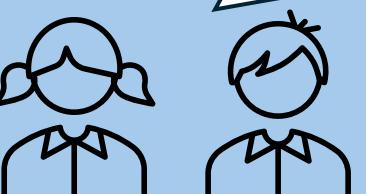

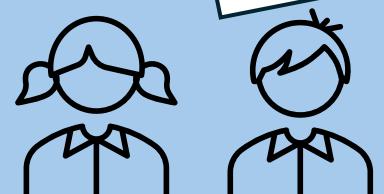
3.3. We collaborate with families to provide sports opportunities – girls football.

4. Our next steps

1. School Sport – celebrating success

4. Competitive Opportunities

- Competitive games – more chances for pupils to compete against other schools.
